In March 2022, ACFP released a major report on Australia's wellbeing, security and preparedness for the future at the end of the term of office of the 46^{th} parliament of Australia:

Part 1 runs for 45 minutes The focus here is on **the state of Australia's economy**. The finding is that Australians are definitely not progressing towards the sort of economy they want, due to the failure of neoliberal economic policies that have prevailed in Australia since the Global Financial Crisis of 2008. Australians are moving towards the polar opposite of their preferred economy. Click <u>here</u> or on the picture below to watch. Part 2 runs for 40 minutes.

The focus here is on the impact of policies for women, gender diverse Australians, the natural environment, climate change, corruption, and foreign relations on our wellbeing and security as a nation. The results are not good. They show Australia is a nation in decline. But Part 2 also discusses Australia's strengths and how we can use those to reverse the trend of decline. 


ACFP media articles
