Drafting Australia Together

Australia Together is Australia's first national community futures plan. The plan will have a ten to thirty year timeframe to help us arrive at our preferred destination by 2050 or sooner.

In order to give Australians an idea of the starting points for *Australia Together*, ACFP is currently working on assembling the baseline data for the plan. We're setting out the starting points so Australians can see where we are in 2020 with the state of our society, environment, economy and democracy.

All data sources are being fully referenced for transparency. We expect this will take until early 2021 to complete and work will be ongoing.



Watch out for the first drafts of *Australia Together* in early 2021.

- Episode 6, Part 2 on climate policy failure and how to fix it by global leadership.



Launching our Community Engagement Program

Our <u>Community Engagement Program</u> for <u>Australia Together</u> was launched in May. It's early days for consultation. ACFP is concentrating on getting sound data and information together for consultation with Australians.

Progress with community engagement is dependent on the willingness of Australians to become involved in the Alliance for National IP&R. We don't need many volunteers for this but to date we've had no response from those we have approached, so

building the Alliance is likely to be slow work. But we will press on. Interested Australians can find out more about the <u>Alliance for National IP&R here</u>. ACFP will start a wider campaign for volunteers on the Alliance in early 2021.

In other news

ACFP's Founder, Dr Bronwyn Kelly has published a major essay on <u>Prospects for journalism</u>, the free information market and democracy in Australia under the ACCC's News Media <u>Bargaining Code</u>. The Code is being lauded by most mainstream news organisations as vital for Australia's democracy. But others consider the Code to be anti-competitive and a threat to democracy. Dr Kelly's essay uncovers problems for our democracy in the Code.





Dr Kelly has also released a new article about the 2020/21 federal budget. There is a gigantic hole in this budget arising from the government's policies on climate change. Read about the serious impact our current climate policies will have on Australia's economy and what we can do to fix it.
