Launch of Issue No. 7 of Australia Together

A new issue of the starting draft of *Australia Together* has been released, the first review of the plan since July 2022.

Issue No. 7 of Australia Together contains:

- 6 new Targets, and
- 30 new Strategies.

It brings the total number of Indicators of the health of the nation that are being measured in *Australia Together* to 312.

The data set on which the plan is based – the *Australia Together* National Wellbeing Index – is the most comprehensive, publicly accessible, consolidated index of national wellbeing in the world. The Index and the plan are vital to the nation's capacity to safely transition to a better future. They position Australians to significantly increase their chances of a sustainable future of prosperity, wellbeing and security for all.

Issue No. 7 of *Australia Together* **has been updated for the term of the 47th parliament of Australia**. ACFP will measure the nation's progress towards or away from our preferred future at the end of the 47th parliament's term of office in 2025.

What's new in Australia Together?

In Issue No. 7 there have been some changes to the draft Vision and Directions of the plan. The new draft includes:

- Minor changes to 9 of the 17 elements of the Vision;
- Minor changes to 5 of the 57 Directions;
- 6 new Targets these are significant additions;
- 30 new Strategies these are significant additions;
- data updates and content amendments in 40 Targets/Strategies; and
- amendments to Target deadline dates in 86 Targets/Strategies.

No Targets or Strategies in Issue Nos. 1 to 6 have been deleted in Issue No. 7. However, a number of updates and amendments have been required due to the federal government's and the 46th parliament's failure to meet targets or implement strategies in Issue Nos. 1 to 6. Australia Together now monitors over 300 Indicators of our wellbeing, environmental health, economic strength and resilience, democratic health, international standing, national security, and our capacity for peace.

It is not only the largest single assembly of factual data about the state of the nation; it is also the most potent source of integrated solutions for the serious challenges we are facing.

This plan has the capacity to do what governments are not doing. It has the capacity to save Australia from ecological and economic crises which will destroy our peace and prosperity.

Some subtle changes have been made to the draft Vision and Directions for Australia Together. These are the result of research about the values of Australians undertaken by ACFP's Founder Bronwyn Kelly while writing her latest book, The People's Constitution: the path to empowerment of Australians in a 21st century democracy. This new draft doesn't reflect a change in preferred direction by Australians because the research hasn't shown that there has been any change. But you might say "there are more brushstrokes on the painting." The new draft conveys a strengthening of a pre-existing preference for a fairer, inclusive and peaceful Australia that is confident that its parliaments can be trusted to act always for the public good.
